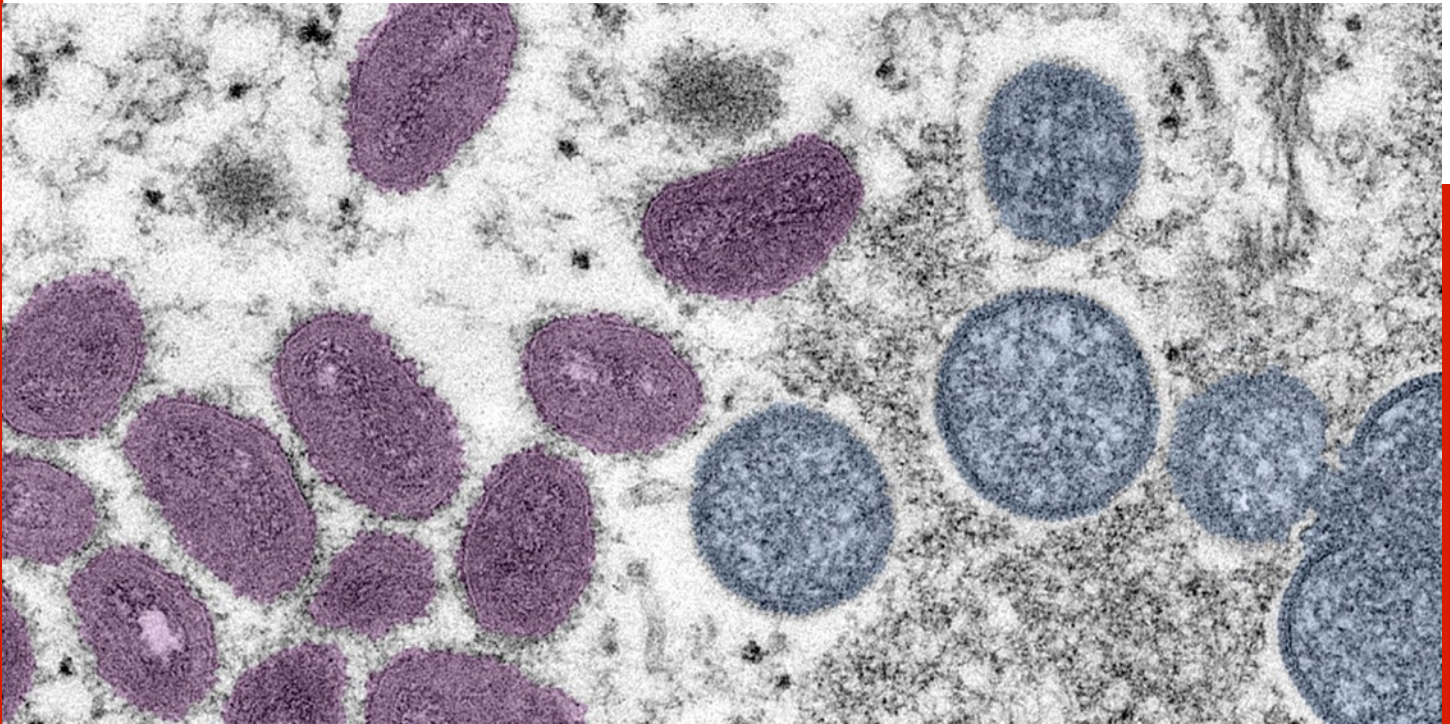


MPOX STUDY

for treatment of human MPV disease



Mpox is caused by a virus. This virus is most often spread by close contact with someone who has mpox.

This research study is looking to see if a medicine, tecovirimat (TPOXX), is safe and whether it helps treat mpox illness in people. This study will also help us understand more about how monkeypox causes illness and how the body fights infection.

In order to join this study, a person must have recently been diagnosed with mpox illness or, based on symptoms and possible exposure, be presumed to have mpox illness.

People who join the study will complete it in about 2 months (60 days). All clinic visits take place on the University Hospitals Cleveland Medical Center campus in the University Circle neighborhood of Cleveland.
